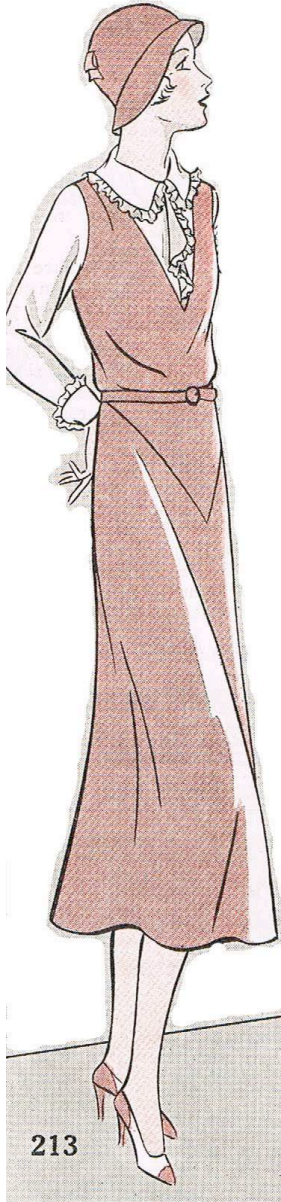


Snappy Jumper Dress
