## Email Tech Tip!

For our club newsletter editors here is an email tech tip to help make sure your emails are delivered to your member inboxes and not to their spam folders. This will also help the spread of malicious software via email.

When composing your email use your email only in the "To:" field of your email.

Next list your entire recipient's into the "Bcc:" field. This way their email addresses will be hidden when the email is sent. When email providers like Gmail, Hotmail, Outlook or your local internet provider see an email with so many names in the "To:" field they will most of the time direct it to your "Spam" or "Junk" folder which you may not check as often as you do your "Inbox".
